Kitchen Facilities including Food and Drinks

Stationery, Printing and other Equipment

Within our centre, we provide all stationary and equipment to help you complete your studies, from pens and pencils, to laminators and printers.

AEC Support Services For Students

Access To Free Tutorial Support

The AEC offers tutorial support to current Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students upon completion of an Individual Success Plan. Tutoring is available to all eligible Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students located across all campuses; inclusive of Ballarat, Gippsland, Berwick, Wimmera, Online and Partner Provider. RUBY SHINES ON HER JOURNEY FROM STUDENT TO STAFF

Tuesday, 23 April 2024

A Federation TAFE student's dedication and commitment has proved an inspiration for her Indigenous peers and shown that forging the career of your dreams is always possible.

Ruby Bending-Norman thought she had no chance of ever studying at university but is now well on the path to further post-secondary education.

"I just want to make a difference. I want to use what I've learned and pay it forward and make change for the better. Don't give up on your dreams because it is possible."

After taking up a Certificate III in Business traineeship with Federation TAFE, Ruby, a Yorta Yorta woman, thrived, and motivated to progress in her career quickly, worked ahead to finish the two-year traineeship a year early.

Not only did Ruby excel with her own learning, but she also supported the learning of fellow Indigenous classmates, reaching out to them as a peer to help them stay on task.



Inspired by this experience, Ruby wanted to continue making a difference to the lives of students and after completing her traineeship, has transitioned from student to staff member, starting a job in Federation University's Student Equity and Inclusion department.

"I'm in a unique position having studied with Federation and now working here. I have worked across both the TAFE and higher education sectors of the university, and being Indigenous I have a lot of experience that could help current students."

Ruby plans on continuing her own studies at Federation University, something she never thought possible after opting to study VCAL rather than VCE in her senior secondary years. "I would love to become a Paramedic, something I'd never consider if I hadn't studied at TAFE. I dropped out of VCE and went to VCAL, and I thought it wasn't possible to go anywhere near that field or higher education because I didn't have an ATAR."

"In high school you're taught, 'get an ATAR and go to university' or 'if you don't have an ATAR, you're not going to be able to do anything'. But I found out there are a lot of pathways to higher education and TAFE is really undersold as an option. There needs to be more of an awareness in high schools about alternative ways to get into further study."

Ruby's efforts were celebrated at the 2024 Federation TAFE Awards for Excellence with the Federation TAFE Growth Award which recognises Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander First Nation Peoples students who have demonstrated commitment to their personal and academic growth.

Ruby was nominated for the award by Federation TAFE business teacher, Tammy Ballard. "Ruby's commitment to her studies deserves to be recognised and celebrated. In the face of numerous challenges, she showed resilience and determination. She hasn't allowed complications to hinder her academic pursuits but instead used them as motivation to succeed. She deserves all the future has to offer," said Tammy.

Treaty Day Out

We are delighted to share with you the success of our recent event, Treaty Day Out, hosted by the Aboriginal Education Centre at Federation University. It was a day filled with celebration and community building, and we are thrilled to have had such a positive impact on all who attended.

Treaty is our opportunity to tackle the racist legacies of invasion and create a better future together as equals. The First Peoples' Assembly of Victoria is the democratic voice for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in Victoria.

Treaty Day Out was an opportunity for us to come together as a community to learn and reflect upon the importance of treaties in our history. The event aimed to raise awareness about the significance of treaty agreements between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples and to promote dialogue around reconciliation and Indigenous rights.

Throughout the day, attendees had the chance to participate in a variety of engaging activities. The Aboriginal Education Centre held an interactive stall and gave away over \$3,500 worth of Indigenous designed merch prizes using the spin wheel. Indigenous hoodies and T-shirts were among the top prizes. Kids had one free spin, while adults had to scan a QR code and follow the Aboriginal Education Centre Instagram or Facebook page for a chance to win. From Treaty Day Out we gained 200+ followers!


