Access To Free Tutorial Support

The AEC offers tutorial support to current Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students upon completion of an Individual Success Plan. Tutoring is available to all eligible Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students located across all campuses; inclusive of Ballarat, Gippsland, Berwick, Wimmera, Online and Partner Provider. Each Scholarship and Grant will have specific conditions for eligibility. It is recommended to read through each criteria via the Scholarships portal online.

Got to www.federation.edu.au - click on the search bar and type 'scholarships'. Click on the first **Scholarships** link. Scroll down to **Types of scholarships** and click on the **Foundation** tile. Use the **search filters** to find the Scholarship or Grant that may apply to you.

There are over 100+ Scholarships any new/commencing or continuing Federation student can access in both Higher Education and TAFE.

In 2024 we have handed out 10 Deadly TAFE Education Grants worth \$1,000 to some of our Indigenous students as a reward for their studies. Below is an example of one of our Deadly Grants in the Aboriginal Education Centre.

Aboriginal Education Centre Higher Education Scholarships

The Aboriginal Education Centre provides scholarships to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Higher Education students to enhance their success at Federation University.

How to Apply

- Apply via the Scholarships and Grants portal.

- **Required Documents:**

- Centrelink Authorisation Form
- Confirmation of Aboriginality
 - **Or:** A Statutory Declaration stating Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent, identification, and community acceptance.

Note: All submissions will be reviewed and monitored by the Aboriginal Education Centre.

Deadly Education Scholarship

Amount: \$2,000 per semester

Eligibility: Enrolled in an enabling, undergraduate, honours, or postgraduate unit. Part-time students paid pro rata. Not receiving a Start-Up Loan from Centrelink.

Deadly Accommodation Scholarship

Amount: \$3,500 per semester for the first year; \$2,500 thereafter

Eligibility: Enrolled in an enabling, undergraduate, honours, or postgraduate unit, and relocated for studies. Part-time students paid pro rata. Cannot have received a Relocation Scholarship from Centrelink.

FEDERATION TAFE WINS WURREKER AWARD FOR INNOVATIVE KOORIE LEARNER PATHWAYS

Federation TAFE has won the 2024 Wurreker Award for Innovative Koorie Learner Pathways – TAFE institute category at the 19th annual Wurreker Awards hosted by the Victorian Aboriginal Education Association (VAEA).

The award is for new and innovative community driven or led programs and initiatives that have improved pathways and career or employment outcomes for Koorie learners in Victoria.



Federation was nominated for Koling Wada Ngal Kurrung or "Let us walk together" junior university camp, and the "Deadly As Day" aspirations day, initiatives aimed at Years 9 to 12 Koorie students.

Koling Wada Ngal Kurrung is a five-day camp open to students from across Victoria. The 2023 camp attracted a record number of participants and was held on Wadawurrung country at Federation's Mt Helen Campus in Ballarat.

The camp focuses on exploring Federation University courses, possible future careers, and pathways into post-secondary education, as well as cultural learning and activities including visits to sites of significance and meeting with Indigenous elders.

In 2024 the camp will be delivered at Federation's Churchill Campus on Gunaikurnai Country and has been named Werna Ngalu Wannik meaning "we walk together". Federation will partner with the CSIRO to deliver sessions on science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM).

Federation was also recognised for the 'Deadly As Day', a Koorie aspirations day for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students from across the Central Highlands region.

"Deadly As Day" is held in partnership with the Department of Education and Training and is an opportunity for Indigenous students to find out more about apprenticeships and trades careers, and post-secondary educational pathways.

Koorie youth also hear from young Indigenous role models who have achieved success in their chosen fields, and come together to connect, celebrate culture, and be empowered.

Federation has also embedded culture throughout university campuses by naming buildings and rooms in local language and creating Places of Being sites to provide a place for cultural and spiritual connection. Koorie culture, knowledge and perspective is embedded throughout the curriculum, and Federation has implemented the Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Workforce Strategy to increase Koorie employment above the national average and provide an Indigenous staff traineeship program. Compulsory Cultural Competency Training is provided for all University staff, and the National Centre for Reconciliation, Truth and Justice works to drive national and regional transformational change in reconciliation.

The Wurreker Awards celebrate the people and organisations that passionately contribute to Koorie training, education and employment and highlight how high-quality learning and experience can open new pathways for Koorie people. Awards were presented at a special event on Thursday 19 September.

Refurbishment for SMB and Mt Helen

The Aboriginal Education Centre has officially moved at the SMB and Mt Helen campus.

The centre is undergoing an exciting transformation, with ongoing refurbishments at both the SMB and Mt Helen campuses. These upgrades are part of a broader initiative to establish a safe and inclusive environment for Indigenous students to connect, relax, and thrive.

Our team will be working closely with Kinaway approved Indigenous organisation Winya, to incorporate Indigenous designed furnishings, artwork and decor that reflect culture.

For students: Each student lounge is adding gaming areas with Xbox's PlayStations, TVs, and pool/table tennis tables. Along with couches, stocked pantries with snacks, stationary and art supplies. Both centres will have kitchen facilities with coffee, tea, and fridge/freezer access for all Indigenous students. And a wellness room to take a break and shut off from all the outside noise. These student lounge spaces aim to build a sense of community during their time on campus.

For Community:

SMB - B Building is in the early stages of operating as a K-Hub. Plans to house other Aboriginal organisations into this space are currently being discussed. With Central Highlands VAEAI (Victoria Aboriginal Education Association Inc) already occupying a few offices, we welcome Uncle Pete Lovett and Jasmine McCaw to the campus.

2024 Indigenous Nationals

The 28th Indigenous Nationals was held on June 23rd - 27th at the University Of Wollongong in NSW. The event was contested in a mixed competition across four sports: touch football, basketball, netball, and volleyball. The annual event aims to bring together Indigenous student-athletes from universities across Australia to celebrate the rich sporting culture of Indigenous Australia, to develop lifelong connections and acknowledge the heritage and history of the participants.

The opening ceremony was culturally empowering. Elders spoke their stories, and Indigenous Nationals participants had the opportunity to sing and dance, others were encouraged to join if they knew the dance, which ended up with mob from other universities join.

This year on the court, we tripled our win ratio. Our team was a force to be reckoned with. While Dallas Hurren took out first place for FedUni for the best dressed at the Nationals social event, with the theme for the night 'get wiggy with it'.



Every year the Aboriginal Education Centre takes a team of our athletic Indigenous students to Nationals to compete, all expenses paid for.

In 2025, the 29th Indigenous Nationals will be held from the 7th - 11th of July at the University of Western Australia in Perth, WA.

2024 Junior Uni Camp

Every year the AEC hosts a camp for Indigenous high school students (year 9 - 11) from across the state of Victoria. This year our Werna Ngalu Wannik (We walk together) - Indigenous Junior Uni Camp was held at the Federation University Gippsland campus on Gunaikurnai lands.

The Indigenous Outreach Project crew started the camp off with a bang, teaching the young mob through Hip Hop and traditional dances about 'No Shame'. This theme is the ice breaker that shifts our inner worries into not caring about what others think, to be proud of who we are, and to never be afraid of being Deadly.

Each morning we started with a yarning circle for the students to have their say, and to talk about what they were expecting to get out of each day. During the school hours of each day, our camp members learned about what we have to offer at Federation University, along with career opportunities that exist through studying different courses in both Higher Education and TAFE. Each day we would go from classrooms, to workshops, to labs, and offices around the University learning about all the different institutes and their purpose. With most of these short sessions having hands-on activities to keep the young ones engaged.

We visited the GLaWAC (Gunaikurnai Lands and Waters Aboriginal Corporation) Morwell Office and also spent a day touring the Yallourn coal mine learning about the rehabilitation project of the land and waters once the coal mine shuts down.

Our camp members also had the privilege of attending the launch of the Place of Being - Warulung at the FedUni Gippsland campus.

After filling our brains all day with university knowledge, students and staff had hours of free time playing console games, table tennis and pool, shooting hoops, watching movies, designing deadly artwork, swimming or just hanging out with their new friends. A Mario Cart tournament was held over two consecutive nights, with one lucky student winning a brand new PlayStation 5.

Life time friendships have been made, memories were captured and we will hopefully their faces soon achieving greatness at our campuses.

The 2025 Junior Uni Camp will be held at the Ballarat Mt Helen campus in the term 3 holidays for any year 9-11 Indigenous student across Victoria.


