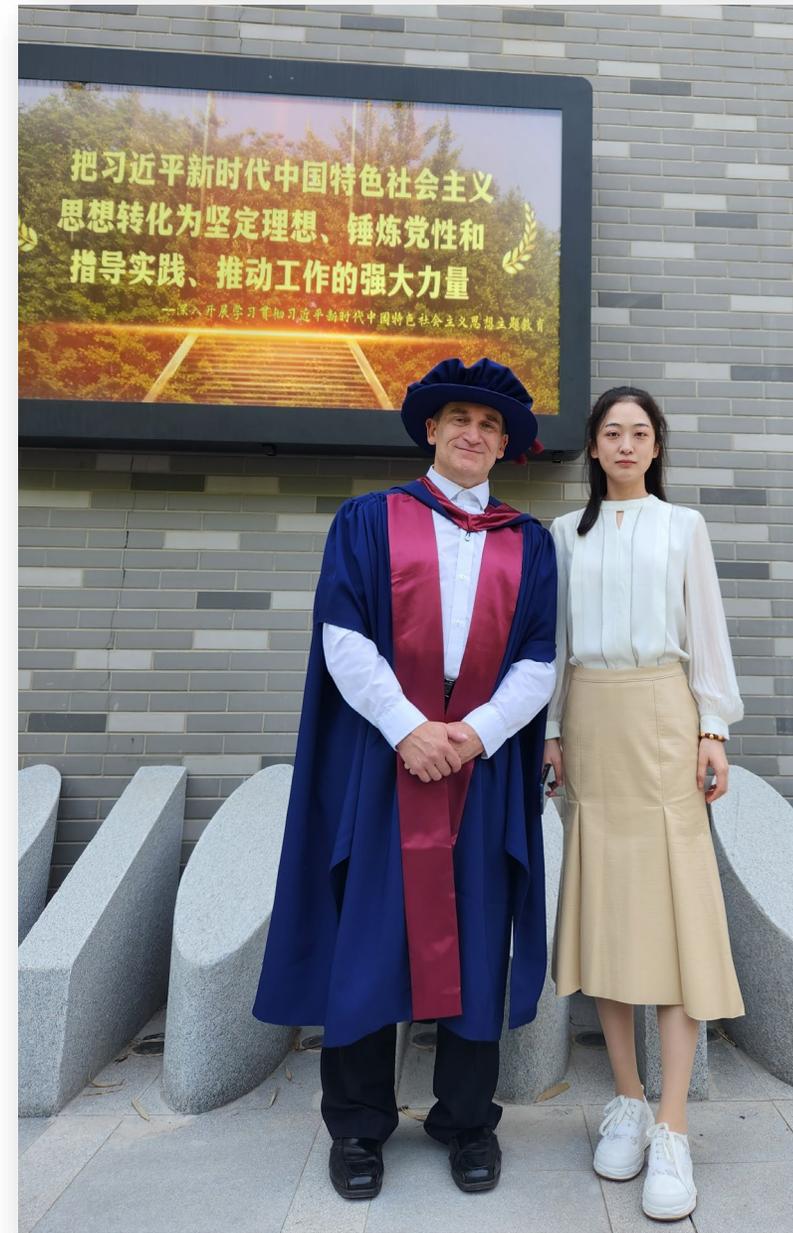

Federation University Information Engineering Institute

- Based within Hebei University of Science and Technology (HUST)
- FedUni courses taught in conventional 12-week mode
- Offering four undergraduate degrees:
 - Bachelor of Information Technology & streams (Networking and Security, Software Development & Business Information Systems)
 - Students are divided across these offerings
- 2+2 & 3+1 articulation options
 - Articulation also mapped for IT Master offerings

The Students

- 800 students across four year-levels
- Joint degrees with HUST
- First year students focus on English and HUST requirements
 - We teach directly into 2nd-4th years
- Live on campus
- Lack confidence in their English skills
- Are “time poor”

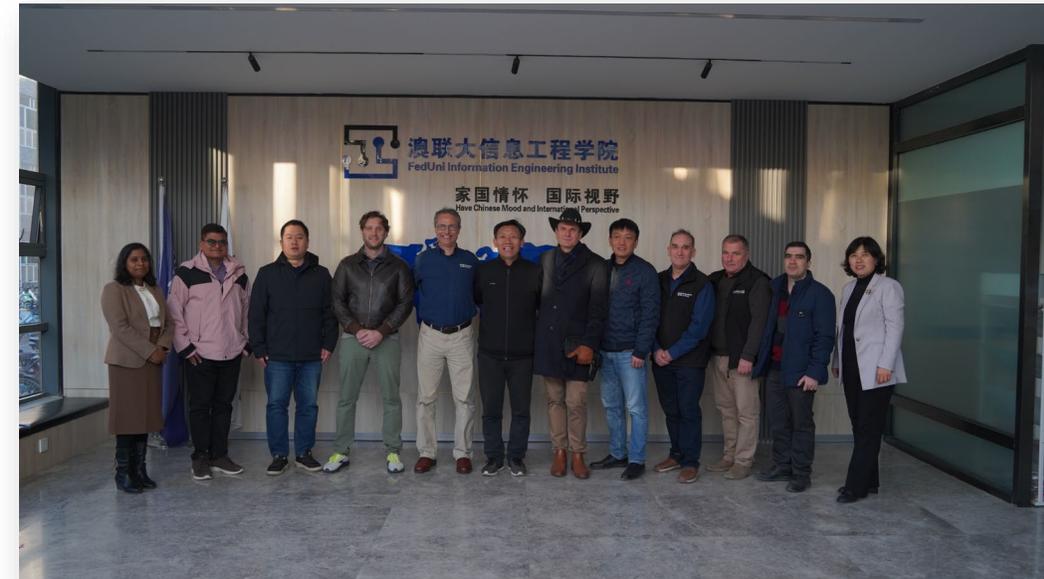


The need for engagement

- Teaching began late 2019 via TEAMS
 - Then COVID.....
- Face-to-face teaching began in early 2023
- There was an opportunity to boost engagement
- Reasons:
 - Strengthen students' all-round English skills
 - Increase verbal participation in classes
 - Encourage articulation
 - Encourage the development of an internationalised student
 - Provide the lecturing team with activities

Engagement Plan 2023/23 – Two approaches

- ITECH1001
- English/Chinese corner activities
- Incorporate the FedUni *Living Values*
 - Inclusion, Innovation, Excellence, Empowerment & Collaboration
- Invite all resident FedUni staff to participate



ITECH1001 Communications & Technology

- A core fundamental skills course in 2nd year
 - Academic and communication skills taught to 200 students
 - First contact with FedUni lecturing team
- Involved 6 members of the teaching team
 - 1 Coordinator, 2 lecturers, 4 tutors
 - Student exposure to a diversity of academics
 - ITECH1101(IT Problem Solving) was taught simultaneously to the same students
- Feedback is very encouraging



2023_23 Dual engagement process

- English Corner
 - Academic led
 - Help improve student English skills & confidence
 - Encourage interactions with the teaching team
- Chinese Corner
 - Student led
 - Teach Chinese language and culture to teaching team
 - Encourage students to communicate & lead



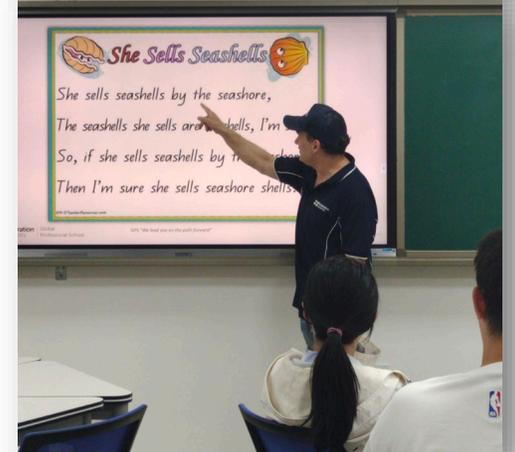
Previous engagement activities 2023/03

- Two English Corner events
 - 1 student from the School of International Education
 - 20 Institute students
 - One FedUni lecturer
 - 10 Institute students
- One “tea party”
 - 4 FedUni lecturers
 - 15 Institute students



English Corner 2023/23

- Tuesday nights
 - 7 events involving 70 students
- Very well attended
- Different themes per week
 - Cultures
 - Food & festivals
 - Music etc
- Activities
 - Film dubbing
 - [Live music](#)
 - Story telling etc



Chinese corner 2023/23

- Thursday nights
 - 8 events and 70 + different students
- The students become teachers
- Chinese culture
 - History
 - Festivals
 - Food etc
- Chinese language skills
 - Greetings
 - Common phrases
 - Shopping etc



Student feedback survey

 - Next semester we will enquire more
- These students value giving feedback
 - We have fostered this culture over time

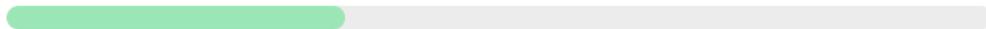

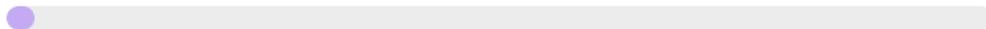

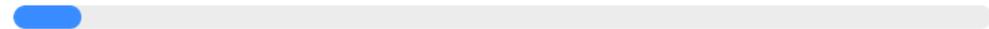

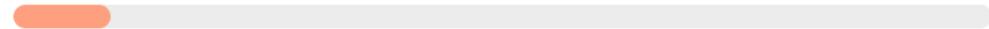

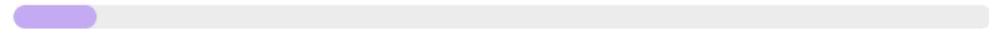

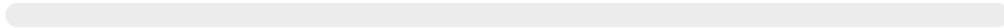
What is your current English speaking level?

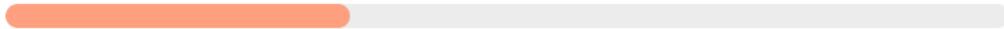

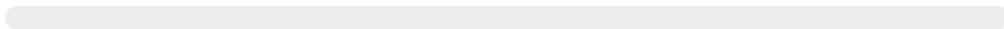
B. I can speak English somewhat fluently and confidently.

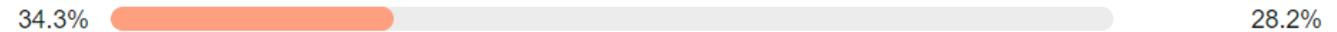

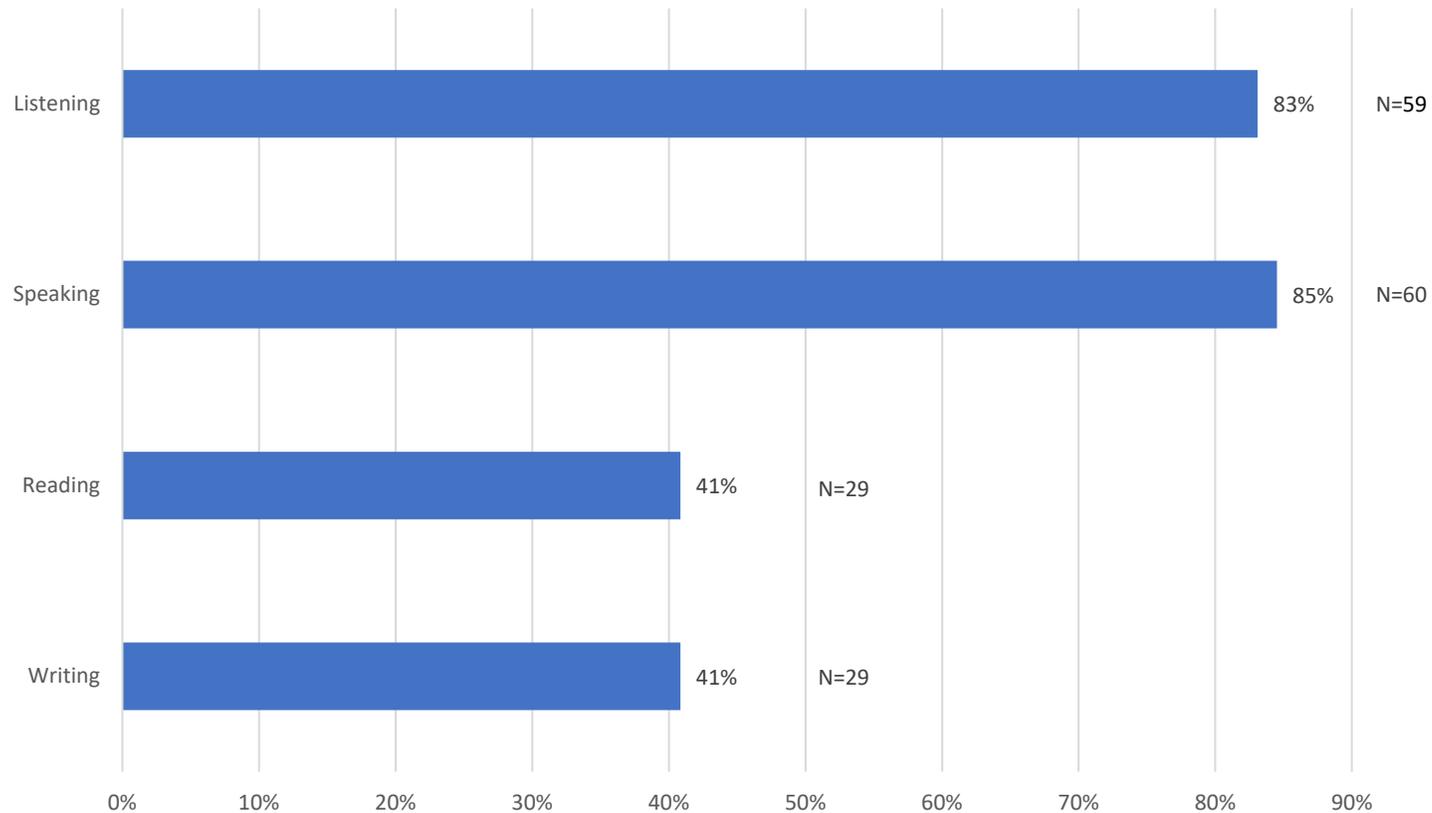
